There are 2, 3, and 4 gun classes, so anyone with a pre-1900 pistol and lever action rifle, or pistol and shotgun, can participate. The guns can be originals or reproductions, smokeless or black powder. New participants can come as they are, since we realize it takes a long time to acquire the needed clothing and accouterments. Gun carts are optional. There is no overall winner in NCOWS; each class is judged independently. There are 12 available classes including 2, 3, and 4 gun classes.

February 20th was our first match of the season and first in the state. The weather held up pretty good, a little chilly winds at times. We had 11 shooters, a full house for us. There was two new shooters in our match. Gary made new targets for this year but one of our new shooter destroyed his. Jerry Hale brought some chili to warm us up. Thanks again. Our high scorer was Jody Bowers with a 2427 37x. Our high expert was Richard Robison with 2395 49x. High master was Dave Salyer 2304-30x. There were 6 Sharpshooters and Larry McCorkle was the top shot with 2291-33x second was Steve Berman then Mike Bumpus, Archer Gravely, Jerry Hale and Isaac McCaskill. There were two new Marksman shooters.

We shoot at 25 and 50 yards, one handed, and accuracy is the main thing that is stressed – speed will come along. We shoot .22 caliber, center fire (.32 caliber or larger), and .45 caliber so you would need about 100 rounds of each caliber. 2700 Pistol matches, an NRA approved aggregate pistol match, are held the third Saturday of each month from February through November, with registration starting at 8:30 AM, and shooting starting at 9:00 AM. The match fee for a regular match is \$25. You do not have to shoot all 3 parts (.22LR, centerfire, and .45) of the 2700 course in order to compete with the group (\$10 fee for each part).

Mid-Carolina Muzzleloaders shot a match on the 27th of March. Part paper targets and part steel. 25, 40, 60 and 77 yards. The winner was Sam Jones, 2nd place Charlie Francis and 3rd was a new shooter, Wayne Albert. Way to go Wayne!!!

We shoot fourth Saturday each month except November and December. We shoot different style matches each month rather than shooting all paper all of the time like the other clubs in SC. We shoot some paper, steel, moving, and novelty targets. Generally all off hand but some bench rest, crossed sticks or other positions on the ground.

Winning is not nearly as important as getting your gun to shoot properly and having FUN!!!!! Come by and watch a match and we will let you shoot a muzzleloader and see if we can get you hooked on black powder!!!!

Round ball with any type of black powder is acceptable, and you can shoot in-lines. They use the silhouette range primarily, and shoot at distances of 25 - 50 - 75 - 100 yards.
