ONE the rules require you to wear safety glasses while you are on the firing line. Not just while you are shooting. Two you are also required to have that id on and visible anytime you are on the range except while you are participating in a scheduled match. I will send you home if you are not following the rules. Gary and Larry will also be watching and have the authority to enforce the rules as does any member of the Executive Committee. We should not have to patrol the range looking for violations. The club expects our members to be responsible and follow the rules.

We had an incident with a new member just a couple of weeks after joining. He had two friends with him on the Hathcock range shooting an AK. No target, just shooting at the 100 yd. berm. After he left we found 6 bullet tracks from the 50 yd line to the 100 yd line. And yes one of those bullets hit a hose. His guests had also run up and down the berm at 100 yds. There is a sign right there to stay off the berm. I have taken the proper action to deal with it.

Highpower / Tactical Rifle

Highpower / Tactical Rifle, matches are conducted at MCRC on the second Sunday of each month. The match is held on the Hathcock range, with targets at 200 yards and starts at 0900 and usually ends around 12:00.

The course of fire is ten (10) rounds slow fire standing, ten (10) rounds rapid fire sitting with one reload required, ten(10) rounds rapid fire prone with reload and twenty (20) rounds slow fire from the prone position, for a total of 50 rounds for score. There is a 5 minute preparation period before each course of fire and sighter shots maybe made.

Highpower / Tactical rifle is a good opportunity to learn rifle marksmanship and position shooting while getting instruction from master level competitors. All you need to bring to the match is a rifle, about sixty (60) rounds of ammunition and have a fun time. The primary rifle for the match is the AR family of rifle, while many other rifles are used such as the M1A, Grand, 1903s, bolt rifles that can be reloaded quickly, or other magazine fed rifles. Highpower is also a very good opportunity for NEW AR owners to learn about their rifle, care, maintenance, use, as certified instructors are at the match and competitors who have shooting the AR for as long as the AR has been around.

Tactical Rifle: These AR rifles will be configured so as to replicate as closely as possible the tactical rifles (semi-automatic) and equipment used by the United States Military and America's Law Enforcement Community in "mid-range" tactical applications. These semi-automatic rifles will be more "off the rack" or "stock" than "competition" in nature. They will be more of a "tactical design" than "match design" and therefore less expensive than the vast majority of mid-range rifles currently in use. Optics maybe used, as are bi-pods and slings.

clothing require greater accuracy and attention to period-correct details. There are 2, 3, and 4 gun classes, so anyone with a pre-1900 pistol and lever action rifle, or pistol and shotgun, can participate. The guns can be originals or reproductions, smokeless or black powder. New participants can come as they are, since we realize it takes a long time to acquire the needed clothing and accounterments. Gun carts are optional. There is no overall winner in NCOWS; each class is judged independently. There are 12 available classes including 2, 3, and 4 gun classes.

Our December match was this past Saturday with 50 shooters competing. This was the first match for new Match Director Tim Voravudhi. Eddie Hughes was the top Open division shooter and Andrew Crenshaw from Charleston was the high Limited division shooter. Ron Arsenault was the high Production division shooter. In Single Stack division, Dan Girvan from York was the top competitor. Timothy Lindler was the best shooter in Revolver division. Our last match for the season was 19th November. We had 8 shooters. We had great shooting weather and great scores and even chili to finish the season. Our top shot was John Harvey with a 2467-54x. Our only Master was Dave Salyer with 2319-21x. Top Expert was Stephen Williams 2434-43x. Steve Berman just became an Expert and first in the .22 and finished second Expert with a 2361-36x. Top Sharpshooter was Larry McCorkle with 2363-41x followed by Archer Gravely 2321-28x, Bob Penny who shot .22 only coming back from an injury and Jerry Hale who provided the chili. We will back again in February.

We shoot at 25 and 50 yards, one handed, and accuracy is the main thing that is stressed – speed will come along. We shoot .22 caliber, center fire (.32 caliber or larger), and .45 caliber so you would need about 100 rounds of each caliber. 2700 Pistol matches, an NRA approved aggregate pistol match, are held the third Saturday of each month from February through November, with registration starting at 8:30 AM, and shooting starting at 9:00 AM. The match fee for a regular match is \$25. You do not have to shoot all 3 parts (.22LR, centerfire, and .45) of the 2700 course in order to compete with the group (\$10 fee for each part).
