Roy Mullis called the meeting to order and led the club in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance. He also led the club in a prayer. The minutes of the December meeting were approved by voice vote.

**PRESIDENT'S REPORT:** Roy Mullis, <u>roym788@comporium.net</u>, 803-360-1490 Roy Mullis reported.

The month of December and even the first week of January were disappointing as far as range violations are concerned. The biggest problem was members shooting rifles at the plate machine. The rack has already sustained damage to the bullet shield. Excuses ranged from "I didn't know" to "the rule about rifles is up to interpretation". Both of these answers are wrong. First you should know because you went through the same orientation as everyone else. Also, the signs in the bay are plain and very visible. Second, no range rule is up to interpretation. The rules are the rules. Period!

I have placed a notice on the table in the bay which says: Notice, HANDGUNS ONLY, no rifles of any kind, no pistol caliber carbines of any kind, no AR or AK type pistols, no firearms with any kind of a stock or arm brace, no shotguns of any kind.

These firearm types are not even allowed in the bay, these must remain in your vehicle while using the bay. Violation of this rule is a tier two violation and will result in a 6 months suspension or dismissal.

I have been lenient with the violators, trying to educate them but now with damage to the rack it has reached a point to where more severe consequences are necessary. I am not going to let a few members who think they are above the rule destroy another plate rack.

Other violations ranged from shooting in front of the 15 yd. line, to targets placed about 25 yds. Out on the Hathcock range, to crossing over the railroad ties in the Silhouette bay to shoot and placing targets away from the berms in the same bay.

#### **Status of the CMP 1911s, 1/29/2018:**

The CMP has been authorized to receive 8,000 1911 type pistols from the United States Army.

The 1911s have been received by the CMP. A complete inventory will be conducted over the course of this week. The pistols will then be securely stored until the Army-approved 1911 building and armory infrastructure is completed. That completion is anticipated to be approximately 60 days from now. Once the 1911 armory is completed, inspection, grading, repair, and ultimately test firing of the pistols will begin. (Please be aware that the CMP was led to believe that we were ready to move forward, but three weeks ago facility requirements were changed, and we are now fulfilling those requirements.)

The CMP 1911 order packet will be posted 90 days prior to the order acceptance date and opening sales date. No orders will be accepted prior to that date. Please visit <a href="www.thecmp.org">www.thecmp.org</a>, click on the Sales icon then 1911 Information, for the latest. CMP customer service has been inundated with calls and emails concerning the 1911s and no further information is available at this time.
