We should all be watching to keep the place safe. Watching for things like eye and ear protection, safe gun handling, and that badges are being worn. That targets are being placed properly to avoid bullets hitting the ground or going over a berm. If you see me or Larry or for that matter any other member watching you, if you are not doing anything wrong you don't have anything to be concerned about. Maybe we're impressed with your shooting ability.

Yes, we are watching. We are not going to let one person get this range closed down or God forbid someone get shot because another person is doing something dumb. Listen to the new members when they say why they want to join MCRC. It is repeated over and over again. "I want a SAFE place to shoot". Clay and I drill the rules into members for 4 hours at the briefing. Only if they follow those rules will MCRC be safe and remain open. I continue to remind everybody that we are one wayward bullet away from losing our range.

The only "misfire" we had, was that our new coffee pot failed to percolate and would not render anything stronger than tea. But we'll have that tuned up by the next match.
