I encourage all the discipline directors to personalize their matches on the event calendar and to add posts with pictures and videos added to their postings on the website. Word Press is getting ready to upgrade the dashboard program, and they claim it will be easier to use. Any match director who needs help, please contact me & I will set up a time to meet and go over how to update the website.

I sent out reminders regarding renewal to members expiring in November & December. I plan on sending out reminders the beginning of each month for those who expire within the next 60 days. It is just a reminder. If you have already paid or put the renewal in the mail - great! The message was not intended for you. It is intended for all the folks who seem to be unaware that the expiration date is on your member ID. Also, we all tend to get busy with work, families and the other stuff in our lives, so a reminder can help.

We are aware that there are some problems with printing renewal forms with certain computer operating systems. I have had members contact me with problems with older versions of Windows and also with using remote printing with iPad tablets. If you cannot get the renewal to print, contact me. I can either have you email me the form & print it, or I will complete the form while I have you on the phone & print it. Depending on how fast you need it, I will either mail it to you or leave it at the range for you to pick up. And Roy always has hard copies available at the range. We both bring extra copies to the meeting.

Again, a reminder that Apple mobile devices have a built-in "PDF viewer" which does just what it says - users can view the form, but it will not let users fill out a form. If you access all internet sites with an Apple mobile device, Adobe recommends that you get an App to open Adobe forms. This only applies to mobile devices - not to MACs. Please remember to contact me by phone, email or text message if you have questions about your membership (renewals, credits, forms needed, etc).

And the good news is that I think I have a plug-in program to create the CWP calendar area of the website. I got a recommendation just before Toys for Tots & was too busy to install it and see if it will suit the club's needs. But I should be able to do that later this month.

## **OLD BUSINESS:**

**Proposed amendment to By Laws.** Roy Mullis, last reading.

Amendment 1 – Proposal to modify Article VI of the bylaws, Section 4, relating to the length of term for officers.

Article VI, Section 4, states, “The term of office for elected officers shall run from January 1<sup>st</sup> to December 31<sup>st</sup>.”

This proposal is to modify this line to: “The term of office for elected officers shall run to 24 consecutive months from January 1<sup>st</sup> of the first year to December 31<sup>st</sup> of the second year.”

Linda Chico stated that there was Toys for Tots swag (key chains, magnets, stickers, etc.) at the door for members. She emphasized that this charity drive is a club-wide project. Donations come in from several disciplines (USPSA, IDPA, Light Rifle, Cowboys) as well as individual members.
