Roy Mullis reported.

I thought I would give you a rundown on the state of the range today. This being the new year. The range experienced a lot of rain last year and continues which resulted in the continuing erosion. Some bays fared better than others. Bay 1 in the cooper bays washes easily and requires more attention than the others. The silhouette bay is going to be a continuing problem. I did manage to get 7 different areas painted but the rain/cold stopped that. Come spring I'll jump back on the painting.

We've lost several matches to loss of attendance and worn out directors. Pistol silhouette, the buffalo match, and IDPA. On the other hand 2700 /precision pistol has made a strong comeback and small bore prone seems to be doing ok.

We currently have 838 members listed on member ties. Of that 141 are expired. That is a floating number because of late renewals or delayed updating.

There has been an increased number of range violations. Mostly minor but unfortunately a few major. They range from not policing trash to bullets hitting the ground. I try at every opportunity to use these situations as an educational experience for the member. Reminding them of the rules. I hear "I didn't know" a lot. I've had brand new members violate rules and I've had just as many long time members violate rules. I attribute the new member's violations to not paying attention in the briefing. I attribute the long time member's violations to not keeping up with the rules. There are long standing rules there and very recent changes. There are rules posted on every bay so I didn't know doesn't fly. I encourage all members to review the rules.

The National Congress of Old West Shootists (NCOWS) match that scheduled for Sunday, January 13, 2019, was once again, regrettably postponed due to bad weather. It has been rescheduled for Sunday, February 10, 2019.

Sadly, one of our staunchest members, Capt. JEB Forrest (also known as Michael Fischer) passed away, over Christmas. The memorial service was held in Albermarle, North Carolina January 12th. It was very well attended. In addition to family and friends, approximately 50 cowboys and cowgirls, all dressed in full western regalia, from several posses of both the Single Action Shooting Society and National Congress of Old West Shootists, all showed up to pay their respects. Capt. JEB served as our posse secretary and as an NCOWS Senator. Even when he wasn't feeling well enough to shoot the match, Capt. JEB showed up anyways, to keep score. Capt. JEB was the first person you noticed at our matches and the one you most remembered.

Our matches are normally held on **the second Sunday of each month**, except for November to accommodate the Toys for Tots benefit match and unless otherwise specified. Match fee is \$15.00 (\$8.00 for first match and juniors, no charge for age 12 and under). Please come and check us out; or better yet, join in the fun. No need to be shy, we are a very friendly and family oriented group. Sgt. Henry's signature Cowboy Coffee and donuts provided at most matches.

NCOWS uses rules similar to SASS Cowboy matches, although NCOWS pays greater attention to historical accuracy concerning our guns, clothing and equipment. New participants are given generous allowances, since we realize it takes a long time to acquire needed clothing and accoutrements. Gun carts are optional, rifle racks are provided. We shoot in 2, 3 and 4-gun classes. Generally, any pre-1900 pistol, rifle in pistol caliber, and/or shotgun may be used. These can be originals in serviceable condition or reproductions. Additionally, we shoot smokeless and black powder. There is no overall winner in NCOWS matches; each class is judged independently. Come for the coffee, stay for the fun.

14 bills regarding firearms had been pre-filed by the Legislature. He highlighted two of the bills:

SC House bill H3059 would require that every transfer of a firearm within the state of South Carolina, except those among immediate family members, will require an National Instant Background Check, as well as having the entire transaction be completed through an FFL Holder.

On the Senate side, SC Senate bill S158 would require that all school officials report to SLED and for federal Background reporting when a child has mental health issues so that law enforcement can deal with firearms in the home.

These are just two of the bills impacting gun owners that have been proposed for the next legislative session. Patrick will give a more up-to-date report at the next meeting

OLD BUSINESS:

Roy Mullis reminded everyone that the SC State Steel Challenge Match would be held the third weekend in March, starting with set-up on March 14th.

NEW BUSINESS:

Patten Watson posed a question about the possibility of every match discipline charging an additional fee to non MCRC members. The extra fee could apply to those who come and shoot a local match at MCRC but are not members of the club. There was a discussion regarding that suggestion. Linda Chico spoke on behalf of USPSA, opposing any additional fees. Bob Hoban spoke on behalf of IDPA, referencing the recent problems at Palmetto Gun Club near Charleston, and suggesting that this was probably not a good idea for our club. Patten said he simply wanted to encourage more discussion, and invited match directors and club members to contact him by email with additional thoughts on this subject.

Derrick Hernandez made a request for a Safety Officer Training course: Our USPSA group is hosting a Level 2 Chief Range Safety Officer course in late February. USPSA organizes the class by sending an experienced instructor to train our local competitors so that matches are conducted safely and within the rules of our sport. Instructors are unpaid volunteers. The Saturday portion of the class will be at a meeting room in a local hotel. The Sunday portion of the class requires a half day of Range Time. They need to use 2 pistol bays from 8AM until 12 noon on Sunday, February 24th. The remaining 4 pistol bays would still be open for members who wish to shoot Sunday morning. The reason for the early start is that USPSA sends the course instructor & the instructor will need to get to the airport to return home. I'd like to make a motion to allow USPSA to reserve 2 pistol bays and begin shooting at 8AM on February 24th. The motion was seconded & passed on a voice vote.

Derrick Hernandez made a second request: The MCRC USPSA shooters are planning a New Shooter Clinic on Sunday, March 3rd. The clinic will orient new competitors to USPSA pistol competition and Steel Challenge. We would like to do a combination of safety instruction and very simple hands on shooting with coaching, in a non-match environment to be less intimidating to new shooters. Plans are to charge participants \$5 each to cover fees owed to the range. I'd like to make a motion to allow USPSA to reserve 4 pistol bays on from 9AM to 1PM on March 3rd for the New Shooter Clinic. The motion was seconded & passed on a voice vote.

The next mandatory safety briefing for new members will be held on Saturday January 26th starting at 8:30 a.m. Eye and ear protection are required. Plan to spend three hours, and that includes a portion of time walking around on the range. So, dress appropriately for the weather.
