A reminder that our USPSA group is hosting a Level 2 Chief Range Safety Officer course February 23 & 24. USPSA organizes the class by sending an experienced instructor to train our local competitors so that the matches are conducted safely and within the rules of our sport. Instructors are unpaid volunteers. The Saturday portion of the class will be at a meeting room in a local hotel. The Sunday portion of the class requires a half day of Range Time. They will use 3 pistol bays from 8AM until 12 noon on Sunday, February 24th. The remaining pistol bays would still be open for members who wish to shoot Sunday morning.

The MCRC USPSA shooters are planning a New Shooter Clinic on Sunday, March 3rd. The clinic will orient new competitors to USPSA pistol competition and Steel Challenge. We will feature a combination of safety instruction and very simple hands on shooting with coaching, in a non-match environment to be less intimidating to new shooters. Cowboy Action is an action shooting sport sanctioned by SASS – Single Action Shooting Society. Single Action means the guns have to be cocked before they will fire and must be pre 1900 original or replica, most use new production replicas. The shooter must have 2 revolvers, a lever action rifle chambered in a pistol caliber and a shotgun. The shotgun may be a double barrel, a lever action or an exposed hammer pump action. Ammo is low velocity exposed lead bullets, no jacketed bullets because we shoot steel targets at close range. A typical match has 6 stages with a different scenario on each stage. Each stage is timed and usually consists of 5 rounds from each pistol, 10 rounds from the rifle and 4 rounds from the shotgun with movement between each shooting string. At the end the times are added up and the lowest time wins!

Our last match was January 20th. We had 26 shooters come out. The top 5 were: 5th Knot Hardly Dunn, 4th Sue Render, 3rd Kid Ray, 2nd Shamrock Sadie, 1st Cowboy Junky. There were 7 clean shooters. Our next match is February 17th. Registration begins at 8:30, Shooters Meeting at 9:30, shoot shortly after. We always enjoy people coming out to see what all the fun is about.

There currently are 12 Bills in the Senate and 20 Bills in the House that have some relevance to firearms ownership, possession, or carry. Listed below, they are a mixture of versions of Bills that were not passed in the 2017-2018 session, and some novel ones. I would urge you to keep copies of these lists for future reference as they move through the legislative process. Noteworthy are:

- Proposing changes in background checks: S0054, S0055, H3058, H3059
- "Constitutional Carry:" S0139, S0400, H3456
- Reporting of disqualifying possession/ownership/carry: S0154, S034, H3248
- Against threatening with a firearm: S0276
- Restricting CWP carry: S0421
- Allow CWP carry in a school when used for a religious service, and reduce liability for firearm use during: S0293, H3774
- Confiscation of legally-owned firearms: S158, H3275
- Greater ability of officials and government/Leo retirees to carry: S0379, H3073, H3171, H3472
- Increased sentence for unlawful carry: H3053
- Child Endangerment if allowed access: H3061
- Open Carry: H3363
- 7% tax on sale of firearm for "School Safety Find:" H3109
- CWP carry onto property without permission: H3178
- Bans on "assault weapons," large-capacity magazines, and/or accelerators (e.g. bump stocks): H3206, H3240
- Reporting loss or theft of a firearm: H3643
- "Limited pardon" to allow a non-violent felon to have/use a firearm for hunting: H3693
