Our matches are normally held on **the second Sunday of each month**, except for November to accommodate the Toys for Tots benefit match and unless otherwise specified. Match fee is \$15.00 (\$8.00 for first match and juniors, no charge for age 12 and under). Please come and check us out; or better yet, join in the fun. NCOWS uses rules similar to SASS Cowboy matches, although NCOWS pays greater attention to historical accuracy concerning our guns, clothing and equipment. Additionally, we shoot smokeless and black powder. There is no overall winner in NCOWS matches; each class is judged independently. Come for the coffee, stay for the fun.

The only path for Red Flag Laws on a national level is to provide funding to encourage states to adopt such laws. The real danger with Red Flag Laws is in the states. In SC, the legislature has a bill currently in the House Judiciary Committee (H. 3275 - Seizure of Firearms and Ammunition from a Person Posing a Risk of Imminent Personal Injury to Self or Others). The BIG problem with this bill is that it does not contain any provisions for strict, significant penalties in the event of false claims, malicious reports or nuisance complaints. There needs to be protections from quarrels with neighbors, or disgruntled ex-employees. Strong penalties will decrease the chance that former spouses involved in custody battles will not abuse the law to improve their positions in family court.
