We normally do not hold a regular match in November, however, on November 16, 2016 we were part of a Wild West Day (Lone Star-Palmetto) event at the South Carolina Confederate Relic Room and Military Museum. Nine posse members came and participated including one new member who joined up at the event, Wade Fulmer (*Ole Undertaker*). Welcome aboard, Mr. Undertaker. Also participating were Okefinokee Outlaw, Doc Who, Cheyenne Jim, Les Deadly, Moonshine, Youghiogheny Kid, Kitfield Kid, and Sgt. R. Henry. We had 2 large display tables and a gun rack, all full of various period firearms, both actual, and reproduction, as well as some non-firing replicas that could be handled by the public. Also on display was some period leather and some modern, Hollywood rigs, for illustrative purposes. We passed out information on NCOWS and our posse matches, and also made information available about all of the other Cowboy shooting clubs in the area.

We had a reenactment of the Hickok vs. Tutt shootout at high noon, staring the Kitfield Kid as Wild Bill Hickok and none other than Okefinokee Outlaw as Dave Tutt (well, he already had the name, "Dave"). Although it started to drizzle by then, the reenactors managed to keep their powder dry and give an impressive performance. The shootout was narrated by our host, Joe Long, curator of the museum; crowd and traffic control was provided by Sgt. Henry. Although we shared the day's event with some Spanish American War reenactors, we were in center stage out front with the public and (forgive me if I am just a little biased, but) I think NCOWS stole the show.

We also had our photographer, Ms. Jackie Smith, take lots of good pics. She does a very good job and is a big supporter of our posse. She took most or all of the pics that were used in last year's article on the Wild West Fest in Aiken.

After the event, Joe Long presented each of us with a special, Confederate Relic Room challenge coin. This coin is not available, or for sale, in the gift shop. Match Report for October 13, 2019

The date was October 26, 1881 in Tombstone, Arizona Territory. City Marshal Virgil Earp, along with Deputy Marshals Wyatt and Morgan Earp, and Special Deputy Doc Holliday, have gotten wind of threats

made by the criminal element in town, known as the Cowboys, and have decided to go and preemptively disarm them. Ike and Billy Clanton, Frank and Tom McLaury, and others, are in the street behind the OK Corral, planning to go kill the Earps. Sheriff Johnnie Behan attempts to stop the lawmen, telling them he has already disarmed the Cowboys. Upon arrival, the Earps and Doc Holiday face off against the outlaws and confront them. Gang members Billy Claiborne and Ike Clanton flee. The remaining gang members go for their guns and a general gunfight ensues.

The National Congress of Old West Shootists (NCOWS) held its Gunfight at the OK Corral Anniversary Match October 13, 2019. Almost a half dozen members came out and shot the match. A brief period of rain preceded the event, however, the match itself was dry and comfortably cool. Cowboy coffee, donuts, sweet rolls and cold drinks were the order of the day. After the match, the members adjourned to Carolina Wings in an attempt to *reshoot the match with more favorable results*. Our next match will be Saturday, November 30, 2019, the 5th Saturday of November. Hope to see some of you there.

Our matches are normally held on **the second Sunday of each month**, except for November to accommodate the Toys for Tots benefit match and unless otherwise specified. Match fee is \$15.00 (\$8.00 for first match and juniors, no charge for age 12 and under). Please come and check us out; or better yet, join in the fun. No need to be shy, we are a very friendly and family oriented group. Cowboy Coffee, donuts and sweet rolls provided at most matches.

NCOWS uses rules similar to SASS Cowboy matches, although NCOWS pays greater attention to historical accuracy concerning our guns, clothing and equipment. New participants are given generous allowances, since it takes a long time to acquire the needed clothing and accourtements. Gun carts are optional, rifle racks are provided. We shoot in 2, 3 and 4-gun classes. Generally, any pre-1900 pistol, rifle in pistol caliber, and/or shotgun may be used. These can be originals in serviceable condition or reproductions. Additionally, we shoot smokeless and black powder. There is no overall winner in NCOWS matches; each class is judged independently. Come for the coffee, stay for the fun.

The monthly smallbore rifle silhouette match which was not reported at the October meeting was held at noon on Saturday the 21st of September. In the standard match there was a three way tie for match winner. After a shoot off, Dennis Eidson of the Savannah River club came out as the winner. Mical won the hunter match.

The most recent monthly smallbore rifle silhouette match was held at noon on Saturday the 19th of October. It was a cool autumn day. Rain began by set up time. It was sufficiently heavy that the match director decided we would shoot at swingers instead of the usual set up. By doing this there would be no slogging around in the rain and saturated sand. Rain was constant during the standard match but let up near the end of

the hunter match. John a newby bravely joined us for the entire match. Mical was the match winner in both events.

The next smallbore rifle silhouette match will be at noon on Saturday November 16th. In November we will have our annual turkey shoot and Mical will come up with another grand challenge at 100 yards.

On the third Saturday of each month, the smallbore rifle silhouette match begins promptly at noon. Set up starts around 10 with sight in and practice after set up is complete. The smallbore hunting rifle match usually begins at 1:30 after a short lunch break.

COWBOY ACTION SHOOTING - Savannah River Rangers: Joe Metz, <u>jmrm3@sc.rr.com</u>, 803-960-3907 and Matthew Haulbrooks Rhonda Metz read the report.

Cowboy Action is an action shooting sport sanctioned by SASS – Single Action Shooting Society. Single Action means the guns have to be cocked before they will fire and must be pre 1900 original or replica, most use new production replicas. The shooter must have 2 revolvers, a lever action rifle chambered in a pistol caliber and a shotgun. The shotgun may be a double barrel, a lever action or an exposed hammer pump action. Ammo is low velocity exposed lead bullets, no jacketed bullets because we shoot steel targets at close range. A typical match has 6 stages with a different scenario on each stage. Each stage is timed and usually consists of 5 rounds from each pistol, 10 rounds from the rifle and 4 rounds from the shotgun with movement between each shooting string. At the end the times are added up and the lowest time wins!

Our last match was October 20th. Weather was cool and cloudy.

18 shooters came out. Top 5 were: 5th – Palmetto Traveler, 4th – Whiskey Mac, 3rd – Kid Ray, 2nd – Stone Ground, 1st – Bulls Head Bill.

We had 3 clean shooters. That means no misses or penalties.

Next match is November 17th. Registration begins at 8:30, Shooters Meeting at 9:30, shoot shortly after – we would love to have you come out and see what Cowboy Action is all about!

Don Rawls, Chuck Schenk, Mike Dawson, John Twilley, Erick Holt, Roy Johnson & Bob Bailey. There were 31 shooters for the match. Top score for the day was turned in for Bob Bailey (COP) at 84.45 seconds. Mr. Bailey is rated Expert. The top score turned in for Custom Defensive Pistol (CDP) Division was for Gerald Douglas with 101.61 seconds. Mr. Douglas is rated Expert. Master rated shooter Tim Fritz posted the best score in CCP with 104.79 seconds. The top score turned in for Enhanced Service Pistol (ESP) was for Jack Gassaway with 116.67 seconds. MCRC member Lee Rouse posted the top time for Pistil Caliber Carbine (PCC) with 118.38 seconds. The top score turned in for Stock Service Pistol (SSP) was for Mike Griggs (an Unrated Novice, Senior & LEO) at 139.20 seconds. Stephen Galentine (Novice in SSP) had the top score turned in for a Novice at 143.77 seconds. Charles Schenck had the top score turned in for the Revolver Division at 445.51 seconds. This was the first match Mr. Schenck shot in about 11 years. He beat out the only other Revolver shooter, 4 years Mr. Schenck's senior who was hobbling around the best he could and taking careful aim.
