The South Carolina Old West Shootists met for our regularly scheduled match Sunday, January 12, 2020. During the lead up to the match, the forecast began calling for rain. Our posse normally does not hold matches in the rain for safety concerns (the range gets muddy and someone could slip with a loaded gun) and because most of our members just prefer not to get wet. Nonetheless, using the most scientific methods available, it was determined that there was only a mere 40% chance of rain during the time of our match. By some reckoning, this meant the odds were in favor of shooting the match, because by implication, there was at least a 60% chance of no rain. After all, one can never really tell what the weather will be like, at the range. Therefore, it was decided to proceed with the match, and in the event of rain, we would implement Plan B, which was to hold a business meeting and then adjourn for breakfast, although not necessarily in that order. Upon arrival, we encountered wet weather (at least at our end of the range – rumor has it that the Hathcock Rifle Range was relatively dry) so we went ahead with Plan B. Coffee, donuts, and sweet rolls were of course provided, and the posse adjourned to the Lizard's Thicket near the airport, where we all enjoyed a fine breakfast and really awesome service.

Our matches are normally held on the second Sunday of each month (except November) and on the 5th Saturday of such months in which they occur. Match fees are \$15.00, \$10.00 for accompanying family members, no charge for age 12 and under. Please come and check us out; or better yet, come join in the fun. We are a very friendly, family oriented group. New shooters and beginners are welcome. Coffee, donuts, sweet rolls, bottled water and Gatorade are provided at most matches.

The National Congress of Old West Shootists (NCOWS) was founded in 1994 to promote safe Western Action Shooting including the re-enactment and promotion of the historical Old West heritage of the United States during the period 1865 to 1899. NCOWS members enjoy Western Action Shoots which are timed shooting matches in which shooters compete in a series of different shooting scenarios, called stages. Participants are attired in period correct, Old West style clothing and use firearms typical of the guns used in the Old West.

The South Carolina Old West Shootists is a charter posse (club) of NCOWS and the Mid-Carolina Rifle Club. NCOWS is comprised of many such posses throughout the United States, which hold their own matches and events using NCOWS guidelines. There are also periodic, national and regional matches and events. Safety is emphasized during all NCOWS events, both on and off the range. Loading, shooting, and unloading of guns, is closely structured in accordance with NCOWS and local safety rules. Typically, only one participant at a time will shoot during a match. Juniors and new shooters may be coached or supervised by a guardian or other experienced member, as the case may be.

NCOWS uses rules similar to SASS Cowboy matches, although NCOWS pays greater attention to historical accuracy concerning our guns, clothing and equipment, and more emphasis is placed on marksmanship. New participants are given generous allowances of leniency with the former, since it may take a long time to acquire the proper guns, clothing and accoutrements. Gun carts are optional, rifle racks are provided. We shoot in 2, 3 and 4-gun classes. Generally, any pre-1900 pistol, rifle in pistol caliber, and/or shotgun may be used, either originals in serviceable condition or reproductions. We shoot smokeless and black powder categories. There is no overall winner in NCOWS matches; each category is judged independently. **Prospective members are advised to not go out and buy any cowboy guns or accoutrements without first coming to a match and meeting with more experienced members, in order to avoid spending good money on things that may not be NCOWS-legal.**

COWBOY ACTION SHOOTING - Savannah River Rangers: Joe Metz, jmrm3@sc.rr.com, 803-960-3907 and Matthew Haulbrooks
Joe Metz read the report.

Cowboy Action is an action shooting sport sanctioned by SASS – Single Action Shooting Society. Single Action means the guns have to be manually cocked before they will fire and must be pre 1900 original or replica, most use new production replicas. The shooter must have 2 revolvers, a lever action rifle chambered in a pistol caliber and a shotgun. The shotgun may be a double barrel, a lever action or an exposed hammer pump action. Ammo is low velocity exposed lead bullets, no jacketed bullets allowed because we shoot steel targets at close range. A typical match has 6 stages with a different scenario on each stage. Each stage is timed and usually consists of 5 rounds from each pistol, 10 rounds from the rifle and 4 rounds from the shotgun with movement between each shooting string. At the end the times are added up and the lowest time wins! There are lots of categories for competitors to choose from but that is a discussion for another day.

Match was December 15th. Weather was cool and sunny. 23 shooters came out. Top five finishers were 5th – Sue Render, 4th – Smokey Bandit, 3rd – Whiskey Mac, 2nd – Kid Ray, 1st – Stone Ground. 1 clean shooter.

Next match is January 19th. Registration begins at 8:30, Shooters Meeting at 9:30, shoot shortly after – we would love to have you come out and see what Cowboy Action is all about!

Here are some facts about our matches:

Match fee is \$5.00 New shooters shoot for free

NMLRA rules prevail

Match Director Controls the line and match

Any Muzzleloading rifle or musket with OPEN SIGHTS may be used

Ammo is a Patched round ball

Loading takes place behind the firing line at the benches

The firearm is not primed until the shooter is on the firing line (percussion cap or priming powder)

Misfires are placed in a safe box if the shooter can not clear the issue at the line

Ranges are typically 25, 40, 50, 75 and 100 yards

Scoring is indicated by the numerical values shown on the target. A ball must be at least 1/2 into a ring to receive that score

Novelty matches are scored by the number of targets hit

Linda Chico read the report.

We shot a Classifier Match on the Saturday after Christmas; the 28th. The Classifier isn't a match so much as a measurement instrument of a shooter's skills in IDPA. It has changed. We rate our shooters as Expert, Sharpshooter, Marksman, Novice, etc., by their scores in shooting the Classifier.

It has been over 11 years since I shot a Classifier. Although the setup of the Classifier stage is basically the same, the shot count required has lessened in the basic Classifier, and there is now a "Short Course". Skills tested still include standing still and shooting from around various barricades. Skills with double handed grips, strong hand only and weak hand only are tested. In one stage a shooter may move forward, but is not actually required to do so.

We had 22 shooters show up to shoot the courses to evaluate shooting skills. Most of us had the usual names you see at our local IDPA match. Most of us shot both the Full Course and the Short course. Four or five of the most consistent shooters shot the Short Course with their PCCs (Pistol Caliber Carbines). The Short Course could also be used for BUG qualification (Back Up Gun) because the shot count per string is 5 shots. Because the classifier match does not really designate "winners", I will instead conclude the report with some personal observations.

As I mentioned, it has been 11 years since I completed the classifier stages. Now, I, who used to be able to shoot at least with Marksman skills, must practice to catch up with the Novices. I think some exercises with the old "Four Inch Blue" GP101 with standard grips is in order. Maybe try the 3.5 inch barreled "Twins" with the standard grips. Must find out why I am shooting low and "Dropping my shots".

Our next match will be on January 25, 2020. Come join us! IDPA matches are scheduled for the 4th Saturday of each month. Pre-registration and squad selection is through [Practiscore.com](https://www.practiscore.com) (search for "MCRC IDPA" to find upcoming matches). Setup is usually on Friday afternoon prior to the match. Anyone helping with setup can shoot free the next day. IDPA is designed to help you with concealed carry. IDPA gear should be consistent with "carry gear".

NRA INSTRUCTOR, ADVANCED CLASSES, & CWP: Paladin Services LLC is Joseph KATZ (NRA Training Counselor, SLED Certified CWP Instructor, and NRA Certified Advanced Pistol Instructor and Training Counselor) and Janet KATZ (NRA Training Counselor, SLED Certified CWP Instructor, and NRA Certified Advanced Pistol Instructor and Training Counselor), paladin@busman.com (803-783-0590).

NRA Pistol Instructor special course package: NRA Basic Instructor Training, NRA Pistol Instructor special course package on March 29-29, 2020. The course qualifies instructors to teach the NRA Basics of Pistol Shooting and to apply to SLED for certification as SC CWP instructors. Instructor candidates must complete NRA Basics of Pistol Shooting student class before taking the NRA Pistol Instructor course.

NRA Rifle Instructor Training class will be offered May 30, 2020, for NRA instructors who have completed NRA Basic Rifle Shooting student class, NRA Basic Instructor Training and been certified in another discipline.

NRA Range Safety Officer Training, an essential course for all trainers and support staff, will be offered on Saturday, February 22, 2020.

Defensive Shotgun course will help you learn how to protect your home and family using a basic shotgun and will be offered May 16, 2020.

Home Defense (NRA Personal Protection in the Home) class, September 19, 2020, takes you beyond the CWP and handgun basics to help you develop strategies so you can protect yourself and your family from home invasion.

Defensive Handgun 1 is offered March 14, and Defensive Handgun 2 on April 18, 2020, to enhance your shooting skills and your ability to defend yourself while carrying concealed because the real world outside your home is infinitely more complex.
