Renewals are not processed overnight. The process of going into 4 club programs and the mailing just takes time. It is done in batches to avoid errors and to be less time consuming. When renewals are received, the gate program is opened and your renewal in that program is processed. Then deposits are taken to the bank. We ask that renewals be sent in early. The South Carolina Old West Shootists (SCOWS) held their regularly scheduled monthly "Second Sunday" match for March on Sunday, March 13, 2022, in the Cooper Pistol Bays at the Mid-Carolina Rifle Club. As usual, the match consisted of 4 main stages, which were based on events that occurred in the Old West during the mid to late 19th Century (and, for this match, were the continuation of an interesting story-line from February's match about one of the true villains from the days of the early post-Civil War West, Cullen Baker). There was also a bonus stage, which once again allowed shooters to challenge their long range pistol skills. Given how cold it was at the start of the match, it was collectively decided that this match would be a "misses only" untimed event, since no one was really excited about having to take off their gloves to operate a timer. The "misses only" match proved to be a lot of fun, especially given the challenges of some of the required shots and shot strings, and, at the end of the match, the posse decided on continuing to offer such matches regularly as part of the SCOWS schedule, with specially tailored stages challenging aiming skills. Since the match was untimed, bonuses were scored as either 1/2 miss removed from your score for a -5 second bonus, and a full miss removed from your score for a -10 second bonus, in accordance with NCOWS penalty rules.

We had 9 shooters brave the cold start of the day, but it warmed up pretty quickly and, by the end of the match, it was actually a quite beautiful day. There was one (1) clean shooter this match -- Congrats to Sgt. Henry for shooting clean in the Town Marshal category.

REMINDERS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS:

1. During the match, the posse discussed the pending amendments to the NCOWS by-laws and match rules, which have been the subject of previous e-mails distributed by Sgt. Henry. Of particular note was the proposal to change the due date for submission of candidates for NCOW Senate to July 15, the consolidation off all age-based shooting categories except "Junior" into a single category entitled "Adult", and to add a new official NCOWS-level black powder-only category that uses 1 pistol, 1 shotgun and 1 single-shot rifle. It was decided by voice vote that no one in the posse had any issues with

any of these proposals, either for or against, and, accordingly, it was agreed that the SCOWS representative to the NCOWS National Convention in late March was authorized to "vote his conscience" in his belief of the posse's best interest, on all of these items.

- 2. The next SCOWS match will be a "2nd Sunday" match on April, 10, 2022. Hope to see you there!
- 3. April is also one of the months in 2022 that has an "extra" weekend to it, and, as such, SCOWS will be holding a "5th Saturday" match on April 30, 2022. This match is being tentatively scheduled as the posse's annual Capt. JEB Forrest Memorial match complete with a picnic/Bar-B-Q luncheon and some specially tailored stages. More details to follow.

Our matches are normally held on the second Sunday of each month (except November) and on the 5th Saturday of such months in which they occur. Match fees are \$15.00, \$10.00 for accompanying family members, no charge for age 12 and under. Please come and check us out; or better yet, come join in the fun. We are a very friendly, family friendly group. New shooters and beginners are welcome. Coffee, donuts, sweet rolls, bottled water and Gatorade are provided at most matches.

The National Congress of Old West Shootists (NCOWS) was founded in 1994 to promote safe Western Action Shooting including the re-enactment and promotion of the historical Old West heritage of the United States during the period 1865 to 1899. NCOWS members enjoy Western Action Shoots which are timed shooting matches in which shooters compete in a series of different shooting scenarios, called stages. Participants are attired in period correct, Old West style clothing and use firearms typical of the guns used in the Old West.

The South Carolina Old West Shootists is a charter posse (club) of NCOWS and the Mid-Carolina Rifle Club. NCOWS is comprised of many such posses throughout the United States, which hold their own matches and events using NCOWS guidelines. There are also periodic, national and regional matches and events. Safety is emphasized during all NCOWS events, both on and off the range. Loading, shooting, and unloading of guns, is closely structured in accordance with NCOWS and local safety rules. Typically, only one participant at a time will shoot during a match. Juniors and new shooters may be coached or supervised by a guardian or other experienced member, as the case may be.

NCOWS uses rules similar to SASS Cowboy matches, although NCOWS pays greater attention to historical accuracy concerning our guns, clothing and equipment, and more emphasis is placed on marksmanship. New participants are given generous allowances of leniency with the former, since it may take a long time to acquire the proper guns, clothing and accoutrements. Gun carts are optional, rifle racks are provided. We shoot in 2, 3 and 4-gun classes. Generally, any pre-1900 pistol, rifle in pistol caliber, and/or shotgun may be used, either originals in serviceable condition or reproductions. We shoot smokeless and black powder categories. There is no overall winner in NCOWS matches; each category is judged independently. **Prospective members are advised to not go out and buy any cowboy guns or accoutrements without first coming to a match and meeting with more experienced members, in order to avoid spending good money on things that may not be NCOWS-legal.**

On February 19th, we had 40 shooters come out with 64 firearms to participate in Steel Challenge. The shooters included 3 juniors, 6 new shooters, and 1 lady. Thanks to Linda Chico for covering registration for me, again. Geoffrey Gall led Open in 66.38, and Carry Optics in 61.54. Adam Jezeski won Pistol Caliber Carbine Open in 45.11 and Rimfire Pistol Iron in 53.42. Gary Christopher led Rimfire Pistol Open in 54.62. Todd Syssa led Rimfire Rifle Open is 40.63. Tim Burke won Rimfire Rifle Iron in 64.09. There were 2 shooters in the Limited and Production divisions. There was 1 shooter in the Pistol Caliber Carbine Iron and Single Stack divisions.

Our next match will be on March 19th. We will be running 5 stages. Preregistration thru Practiscore.com is required. If you have problems with registering, please contact me. Anyone who is not a new shooter will be charged an extra \$5 to register at the range on match day. Official Steel Challenge stages consists of 4-5 runs on 5 pieces of steel at set distances. Misses may be made up as long as it is done before hitting the "stop" plate, indicated by a red post. The longest string is tossed out and the remaining times are added together to get your stage time. Stage times are added together to get your match time. Roy Mullis read the report.

The monthly smallbore rifle silhouette match was held on Saturday the 19th of February. This was the first time in a long while we had a full line of shooters. The weather was cool but pleasant for February. The sun was very bright as the sky was cloudless and there were strong dark shadows that made the targets very hard to see.

Scott Lurie down from North Carolina edged out Mical to win in the standard match while Curtis Kesler also down from North Carolina also edged out Mical by a point to win the hunter match. Curtis also had a very good score of 27 using iron sights in the first match,

This discipline consists of shooting offhand at steel chickens, pigs, turkeys and rams at 40, 60, 77 and 100 yards respectively. If you would like to try it, we permit the use of any 22 LR rifle but require the use of standard velocity 22LR ammunition so as to limit any damage to the targets.

Because of the non contact nature of this sport we expect no interruptions in our match schedule. However participants should wear loose fitting gloves for handling of targets, spray cans, and rails.

On the third Saturday of each month, the smallbore rifle silhouette match begins promptly at 11:00 am. Set up starts around 9am with sight in and practice after set up is complete. The smallbore hunting rifle match usually begins around 12:30 after a short lunch break.

Match was February 20th. Weather was cool and sunny. 24 shooters came out. Top 5 finishers were: 5th – Running Bear, 4th – Jesamy Kid, 3rd – Stone Ground, 2nd – Whiskey Mac, 1st – Lighthorse Pete. We had 2 clean shooters.

Next match is March 20th. Registration begins at 8:30, Shooters Meeting at 9:30, shoot shortly after – we would love to have you come out and see what Cowboy Action is all about! THANK YOU to Matthew Haulbrooks and Palmetto Traveler for running the next match!

In Cowboy Action we shoot steel targets of various shapes, sizes and distances, it does not matter where on the target the bullet hits, it is ruled either a hit or miss. A miss adds 5 seconds to the shooters time, obviously we want to hit them "All" as quickly as possible! We typically shoot 6 stages with each stage having a different scenario consisting of differing number of targets, differing target arrangement, differing shooting locations and differing gun order. We shoot 4 guns on each stage, 2 revolvers, 1 lever action rifle and 1 shotgun. Usually 5 rounds from each revolver, 10 rounds from the rifle and 4 rounds from the shotgun for 24 rounds per stage for a total of 144 rounds per match. When we give the monthly report and list the number of clean shooters we had, that means each clean shooter shot all 144 rounds and hit each target in the correct order.
