Roy Mullis reported.

1. Still issues with the gate. Old gate repaired and failed within 3 weeks. Pinched wire shorted operator control card.

Working on new system this week. Doing test runs.

2. Swap meet. April 29th. At this time the main business will be the meet and lunch. I had positive responses from Steel and Cowboys, and I believe USPSA, to set up try out stages and Ncows are having their match that day. They can do their setups and if any of the members are interested they can go participate after lunch time. We are looking at 9 to 1 for the meet with lunch being served from 11 to 1. Members can setup around 8:30 am. The discipline tryouts can run from 12 to 3. I have some 9 mm and some .22 LR to use. I need to know if I need to get any ammo for the cowboys. I need volunteers, possibly 4, to prepare and serve food and do the cooking. I will get the food, plates, water, drinks, cups and condiments. We will cook outside of the juniors building and eat inside or setup in the parking lot according to the weather. Items for shooting, hunting, and anything associated with the sport are welcome. No firearms are to be displayed but if you

have something to sell/trade you can display a list and those can be talked about separately. I need an approximate count of the number of members who will attend to get a count for the food purchase. An email will be sent to all active members asking for a rsvp this week. There were 2 guns in the Limited, Production, and Rimfire Rifle Iron divisions and 1 shooter in the Pistol Caliber Carbine Iron and Optic Sight Revolver divisions.

The monthly smallbore rifle silhouette match was held on Saturday the 21st of January. Turnout for the match was good as we had a nice contingent come down from North Carolina. The sky was overcast which made for good visibility for all of the targets. Temperatures were quite cool but nice for January. Curtis Kesler was the match winner in both disciplines. He also completed his grand slam in the standard class.

This discipline consists of shooting offhand at steel chickens, pigs, turkeys and rams at 40, 60, 77 and 100 yards respectively. If you would like to try it, we permit the use of any 22 LR rifle but require the use of standard velocity 22LR ammunition so as to limit any damage to the targets.

Because of the non contact nature of this sport we expect no interruptions in our match schedule. However, participants should wear loose fitting gloves for handling of targets, spray cans, and rails.

On the third Saturday of each month, the smallbore rifle silhouette match begins promptly at **11:00 am**. Set up starts around **9am** with sight in and practice after set up is complete. The smallbore hunting rifle match usually begins around **12:30** after a short lunch break.

Last match was January 15th. The weather was sunny and cold. We had 19 shooters come out. In Cowboy Action we shoot steel targets of various shapes, sizes, and distances, it does not matter where on the target the bullet hits, it is ruled either a hit or miss. A miss adds 5 seconds to the shooters time, obviously we want to hit them “All” as quickly as possible! We typically shoot 6 stages with each stage

having a different scenario consisting of differing number of targets, differing target arrangement, differing shooting locations, and differing gun order. We shoot 4 guns on each stage, 2 revolvers, 1 lever action rifle and 1 shotgun. Usually 5 rounds from each revolver, 10 rounds from the rifle and 4 rounds from the shotgun for 24 rounds per stage for a total of 144 rounds per match. When we give the monthly report and list the number of clean shooters we had, that means each clean shooter shot all 144 rounds and hit each target in the correct order.

The Juniors program is for those 8 to 18 and is designed to teach safety, responsibility, and basic marksmanship. The program uses air rifles for training and provides an entry into the rifle and pistol disciplines.

The basic orientation course consists of ten hours of instruction, both classroom and shooting. Instructors work with the participants through the course, teaching the basics and offering help and advice as the participant progresses. There is no set "score" to pass the orientation course. Safety is the primary focus, along with basic marksmanship skills. There is no cost for the orientation program: MCRC provides the rifles, ammunition, eye and ear protection, targets, and training materials.

Lawsuits filed in Response to Publication of ATF Pistol Brace Rule; U.S. Senators Introduce Measures in Opposition

The Final Rule issued by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms & Explosives (ATF) on pistol bracing devices was published in the Federal Register last week, on Jan. 31, 2023. This action was immediately met by the filing of two (2) Federal lawsuits in separate Districts in Texas.

Mock v. Garland was filed by The Firearm Policy Coalition in the United States District Court for the Northern District of Texas on behalf of two Texas gun owners, William Mock and Christopher Lewis, who are braced pistol owners. In this lawsuit, plaintiffs argue that the ATF and Department of Justice are violating both the Administrative Procedure Act and the U.S. Constitution.

Watterson v. ATF was filed by the Texas Public Policy Foundation in the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Texas. This lawsuit also argues that the Department of Justice cannot rewrite federal statutes by bureaucratic dictate and that the Constitution gives Congress — not executive agencies — the legislative power to amend laws.

Also, in response to the ATF action, U.S. Senators Roger Marshall (R-KS) and John Kennedy (R-LA) have cosponsored a Congressional Review Act resolution to prevent the new Pistol Brace rule from taking effect, and have also introduced the **Stop Harassing Owners of Rifles Today (SHORT) Act**, which will repeal some of the more archaic elements of the National Firearms Act, including its regulation of short-barreled rifles.

The course qualifies instructors to teach the NRA Basics of Pistol Shooting and to apply to SLED for certification as SC CWP instructors. Instructor candidates must complete NRA Basics of Pistol Shooting student class before taking the NRA Pistol Instructor course.

NRA Rifle Instructor Training class offered May 20, 2023, for NRA instructors who have completed NRA Basic Rifle Shooting student class, NRA Basic Instructor Training and been certified in another discipline.

NRA Chief Range Safety Officer Training offered for NRA Certified Instructors who are also NRA Range Safety Officers Saturday, July 22, 2023. Upcoming Range Safety Officer classes will be held on Saturday, March 4, April 22, July 8, and October 21, 2023.

NRA Personal Protection in the Home Instructor training will be offered October 28, 2023, for NRA Instructors who are certified NRA Pistol Instructors and have completed NRA Personal Protection in the Home student class.
